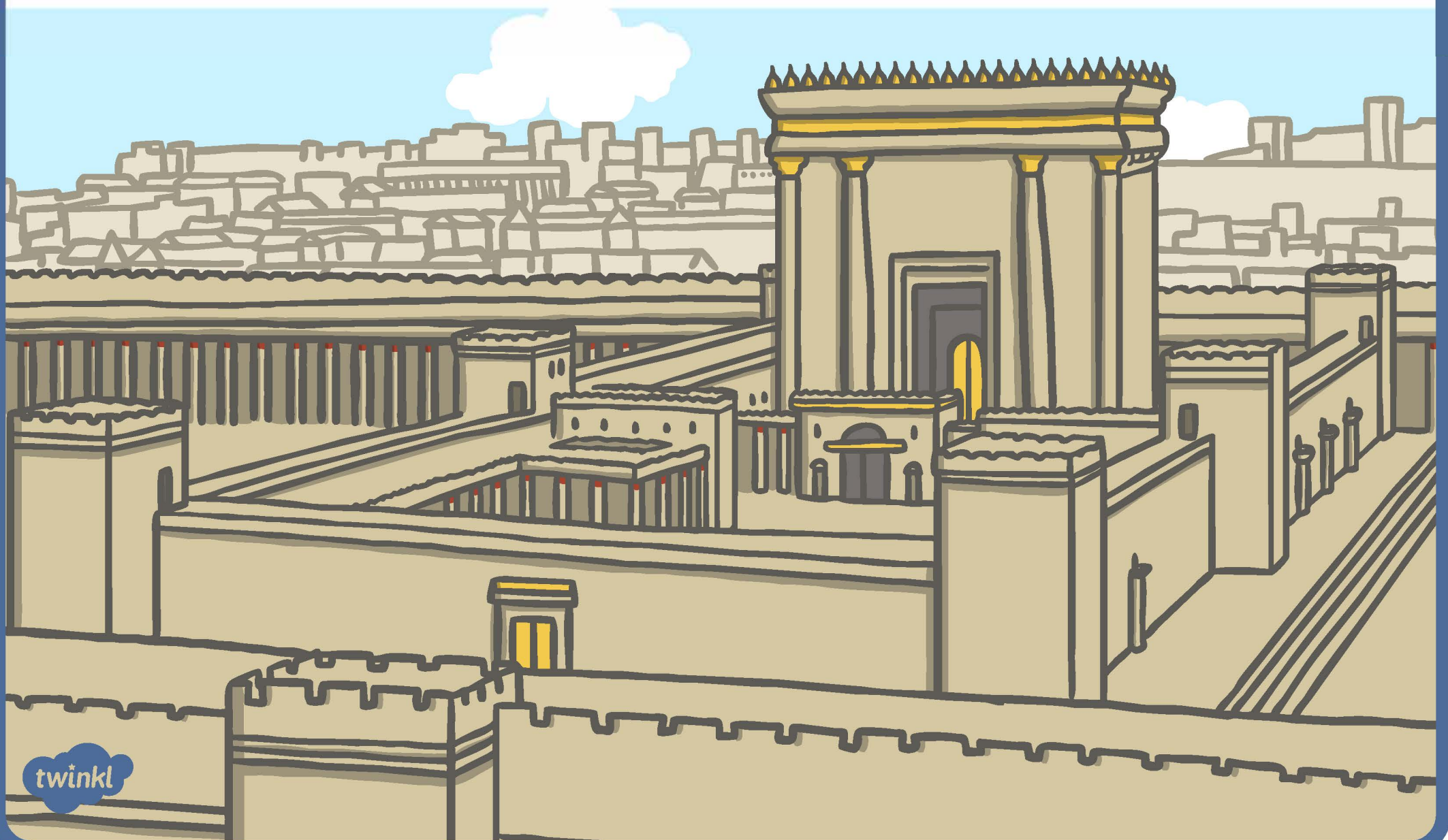


The Story of
